# ABOUT US

We are a thriving community of Christians in Walton. We are a Church of England Parish and 'We aim to show God's love and together make Jesus known to the community'.

#### AIM and PURPOSE

Walton Parochial Church Council (PCC) has the responsibility of cooperating with the Incumbent, the Rev'd Ana Lawrence, in promoting in the ecclesiastical parish, the whole mission of the Church, pastoral, evangelistic, social and ecumenical.

#### **STRUCTURE GOVERNANCE and MANAGEMENT**

The PCC is a Body Corporate established by the Church of England (PCC Powers Measure 1956, and the Church Representation Rules 2006) and is an excepted charity. The PCC is governed by the Parochial Church Council Powers Measure (1956) as amended that came into effect on 2nd January 1957, and the Church Representation Rules. The method of appointment of PCC members is set out in the Church Representation Rules. All Church attendees are encouraged to register on the Electoral Roll and to participate in the election of members of the PCC. The PCC members are responsible for making decisions on all matters of general concern and importance in the parish, and for all financial matters. The PCC meets 6 times a year. # **OBJECTIVES and ACTIVITIES**

The PCC is committed to enabling as many people as possible to worship at our church and to become part of our parish community at Holy Trinity, Walton and beyond. The PCC maintains an overview of worship throughout the parish and makes suggestions as to how our services can involve the many groups that live within our parish. Our services and worship put faith into practice through prayer, scripture, music and sacrament. Also, through nonsacramental activities of hospitality and fellowship, we aim to reach non churched members of the community. The trustees of the PCC are aware of the Charity Commission's guidance on public benefit in 'The Advancement of Religion for the Public Benefit' and have had regard to it in their administration of the Charity. The trustees believe that, by promoting the work of the Church of England in the Ecclesiastical Parish of Walton, it helps to promote the whole mission of the Church (pastoral, evangelistic, social and ecumenical) more effectively within the Ecclesiastical Parish and that in doing so, it provides a benefit to the public by:

- Providing facilities for public worship, pastoral care and spiritual, moral and intellectual development, both for its members and for anyone who wishes to benefit from what the Church offers; and
- Promoting Christian values and service by members of the Church in and to their communities, to the benefit of individuals and society as a whole.

# ACHIEVEMENTS PERFORMANCE and REVIEW OF THE YEAR 2021

The past year was still considerably impacted with the closure of our church buildings until Easter Sunday, and during those months worship was conducted online. When the buildings were opened, Covid restrictions remained which continued to limit opportunities for fellowship and outreach. Understandably many were cautious about returning to public worship despite the steps we took to limit risk. However, the 'Bible Course' was run online between November 2020 and February 2021; this attracted well over 20 participants. A weekly online early morning prayer meeting continued, and the house group has also continued to meet online.

Achievements in church life are not easily measurable and, indeed, we are cautious of putting undue store on statistical outcomes. There are interior and hidden dimensions to the work of building God's kingdom that belie easy analysis. We are, though, committed to the numerical and the spiritual growth of the church.

- It has been difficult to organise community or other outreach events with so much uncertainty, but there was sufficient community confidence to restart the Thursday coffee morning introducing a

'thought for the day', a moment to pause and reflect, as part of our Christian distinctiveness. This event has seen growing numbers and it has been good to welcome both church members and others from the wider community. Other social events such as 'Walton Entertains' also restarted under the guidance of an active 'Friends' group.

- School links have also restarted, and we were able to welcome Walton Primary School into the church for their Harvest Services, as well as individual year groups who came to explore the church and hear more about what we do and believe. Building on these links, we launched a fresh expression of church on a Sunday afternoon, aimed at primary aged children and their families. The first of these was Messy Harvest followed by Messy Christmas.
- As restrictions relaxed in time for Christmas, it was good to be able to welcome many for our traditional carol and other Christmas services.
- Whilst home communions, pastoral visiting and nursing home services were curtailed, much support was offered on the phone etc.
- The national prayer initiative, Thy Kingdom Come, was not as widely embraced as we had hoped across the benefice, encouraging church family to pray for five people, leading to an invitational service (back to church Sunday) in September for those who perhaps had not attended for a while. It was good to see some returning faces.
- We have begun a conversation about a more permanent reordering of our church building to meet current and future needs as well as addressing some of the major, long-term issues with our much loved but elderly building. This is a substantial piece of work with significant potential costs, but one which we can no longer ignore.

# **FUTURE PRIORITIES**

In October 2021, our PCCs met for a day away to reflect together and plan for the future. Whilst there remains much work to do, our priorities for 2022 as a parish and indeed as a benefice, continue to be:

- Connecting seeking to be a church family that reconnects with one another, deepening our relationships and growing closer with God.
- Community rebuilding community links with our schools, nursing homes, places of work and leisure: all those communities where we live and serve.
- Commission reaffirming our calling to be people who are committed to sharing the Good News of Jesus Christ with those around us.

# FINANCIAL REPORT FROM THE TREASURER

Firstly, I would like to thank Jo Pain for her help with counting and banking the cash collected in the church; her help is very much appreciated. I would also like to thank everyone who continued to give to Holy Trinity Walton throughout what was yet another challenging year.

The church was open for the majority of 2021 and this is reflected in the increase of plate collections by just over £1000 but this giving is only 2/3rds of pre pandemic figures. Planned giving is up almost £1000 due to a couple of new regular givers. Friends events have started again and in 2021 generated income of £771. Total income less tithe and parish share is £2645, operating costs are £5899 so there is a deficit on unrestricted reserves for 2021 of £3254.

Monies held at 31st December 2021 total £21910, £9544 is unrestricted, the balance being held in restricted accounts.
